
Institute for Managing Annual Grasses Invading Natural Ecosystems

GBRRU participated in a two-day event in Elko, NV hosted by IMAGINE, a coproduced science, outreach, and education program to develop, implement, evaluate, and adjust statewide and regional strategies for mitigating impacts of invasive annual grasses in rangelands while empowering informed decision making by landowners and managers. Meeting attendees toured a GBRRU research site (2016present) near Izzenhood Basin, north of Battle Mountain, NV. The event also included presentations from University Nevada Reno (UNR) researchers, BLM, Nevada Dept. of Wildlife (NDOW) and Nevada Gold resource managers, and an herbicide aerial application demonstration.

Kirk Tonkel, an Entomology Research Technician at the GBRRU, wants to know. Kirk began a monitoring study this year at two long-term GBRRU restoration research locations using traps to collect surface-active and flower-visiting insects. Traps were deployed at four separate 2-week periods between March and September. Now Kirk must sort and identify all those insects before sampling begins again next spring. It will be a busy winter!
