The USDA ARS National Clonal Germplasm Repository in Corvallis is collaborating with the USDA ARS Horticultural Crops Research Laboratory and the Oregon State University Department of Horticulture for an open house from 10 am to 1:30 pm on Saturday July 17, 2010.

This event will also be coordinated with the City of Corvallis daVinci Days festival. Busses will run from the festival in downtown Corvallis bringing the public to the Lewis Brown Horticultural Farm where the Repository is located.

Stations will be set up at the Blueberry Genebank with Joseph Postman; Dr. Anita Azarenko's cherry research trials; Dr. Jim Myers vegetable breeding plots (featuring his new purple tomato that has anthocyanin and carotenoid pigments) and Dr. David Bryla's blueberry irrigation research (producing the biggest blueberry fruit one has ever seen). Busses will be available to drive the public to each of the research stations. Walking between stations is also permissible.

In Corvallis at daVinci days, the OSU and USDA ARS scientists will set up a booth in "Green Town." The booth will have informative brochures, posters, and blueberry samples for attendees of the festival.
