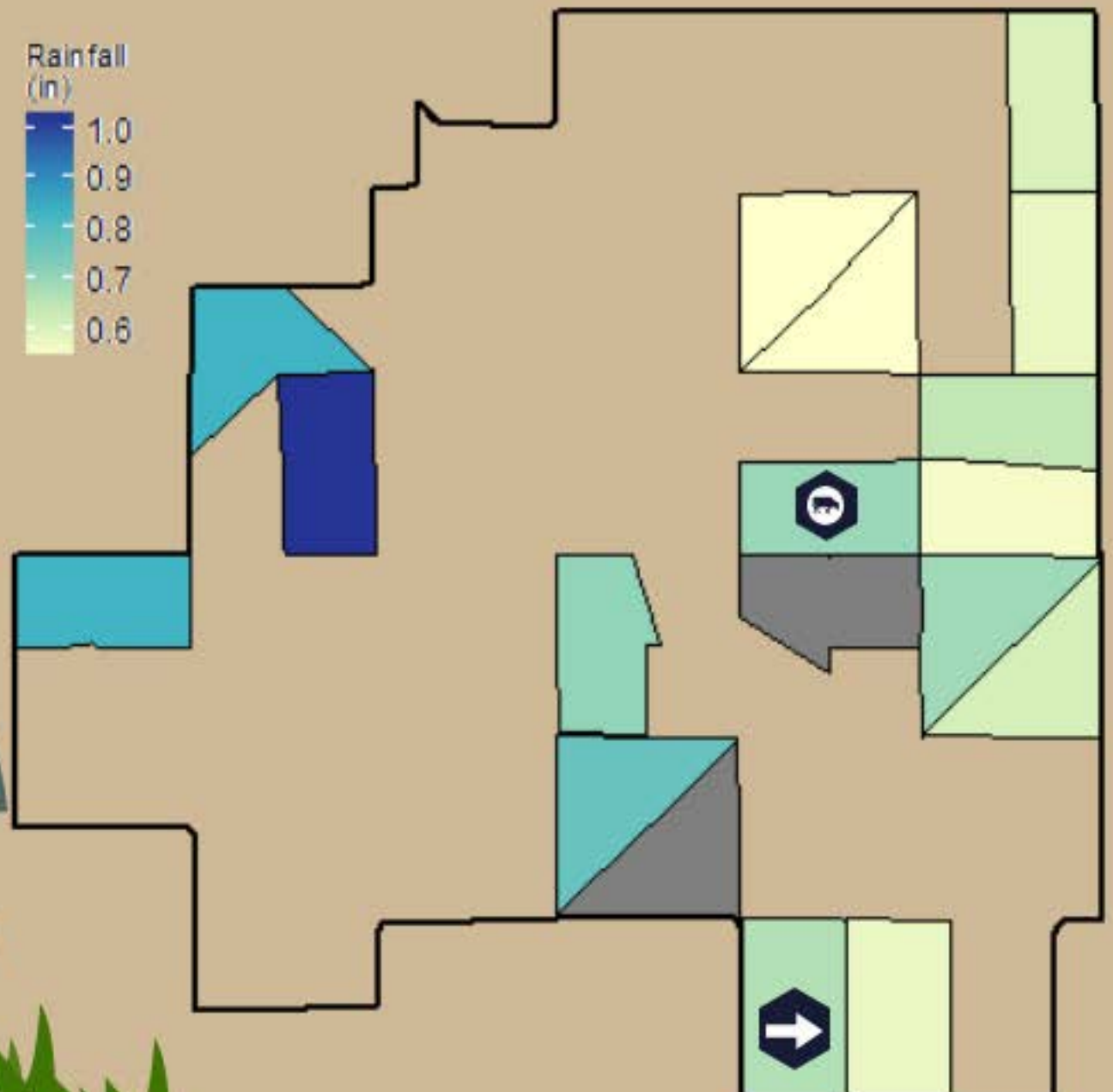
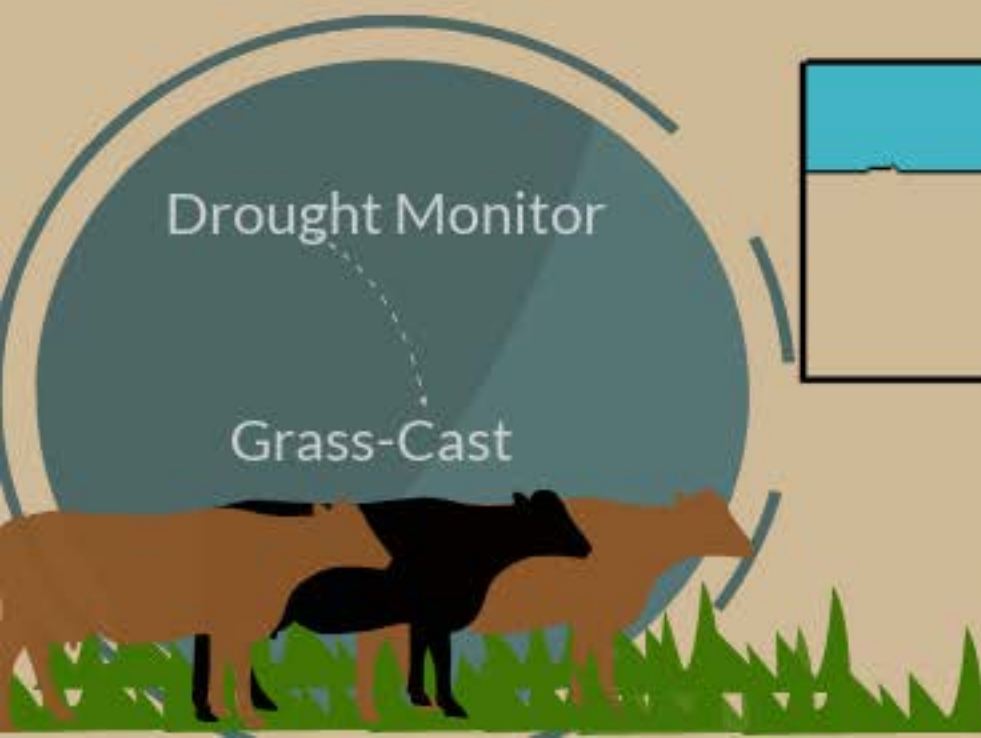
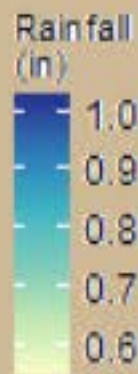
Rainfall Totals

Soil Moisture Distribution

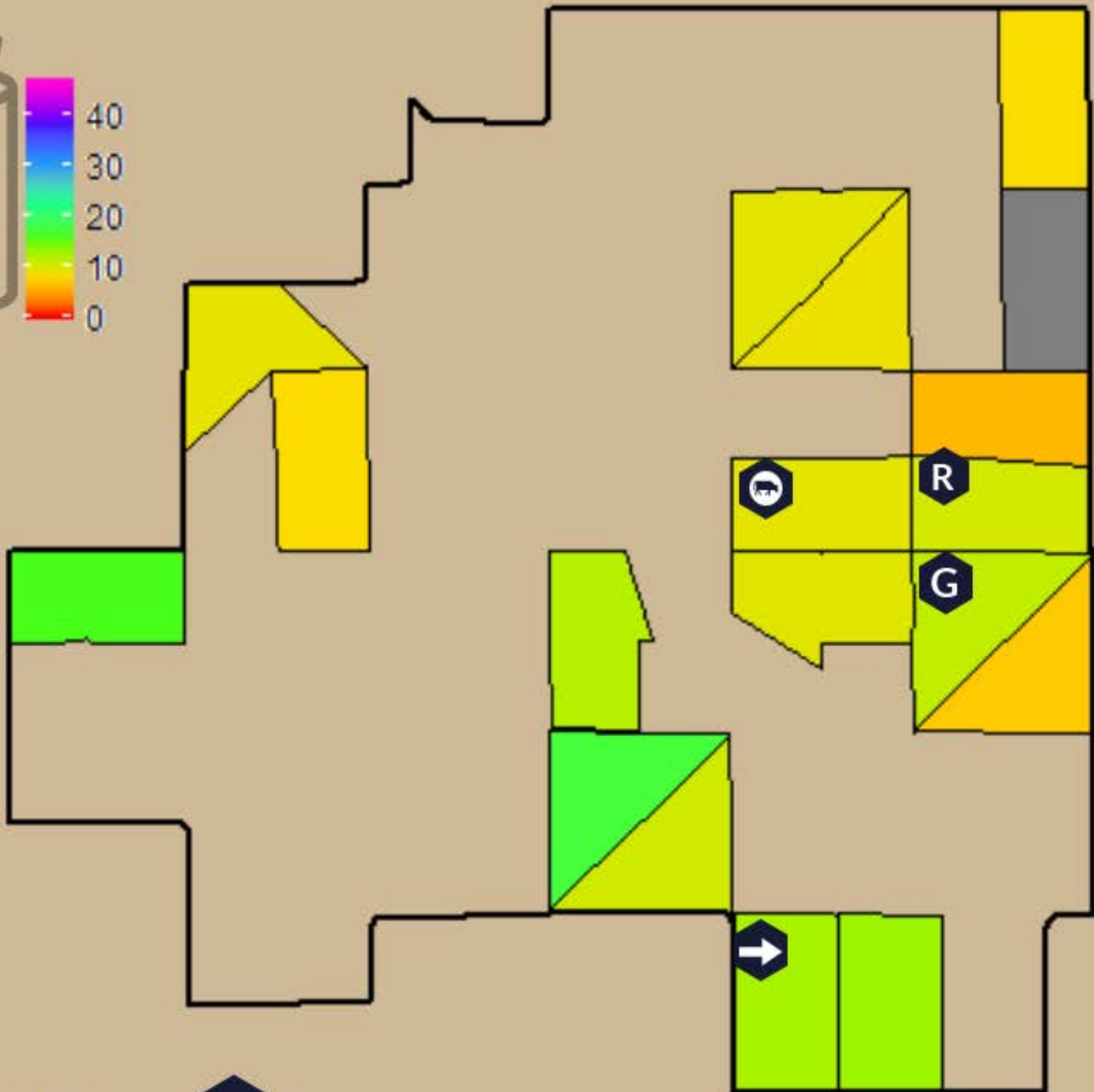
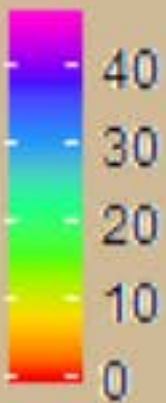
What's in our cup?

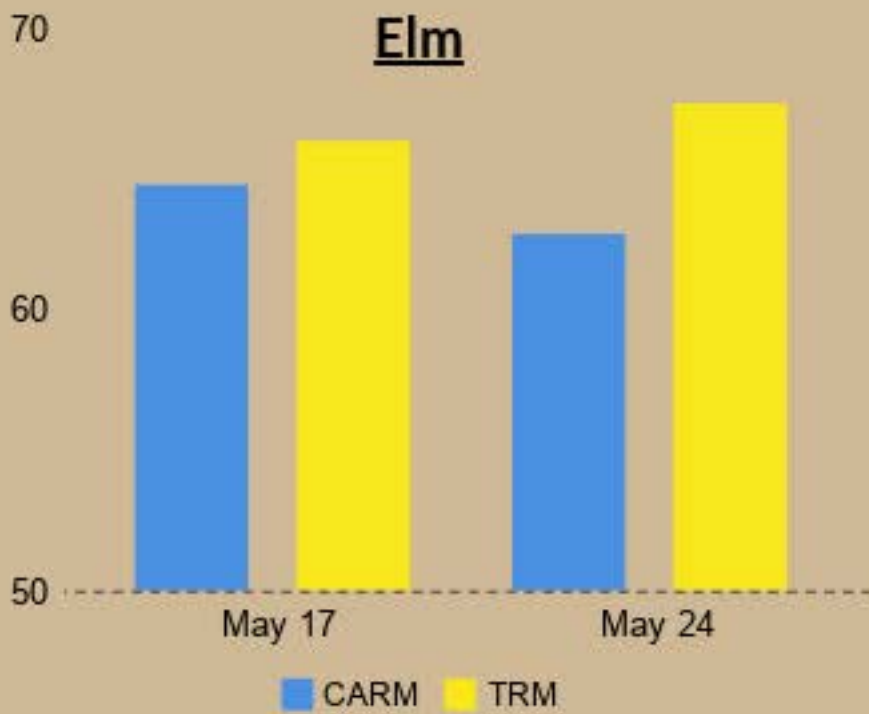
