NATIONAL LABORATORY FOR GENETIC RESOURCES PRESERVATION PVP POTATO VOUCHER SUBMISSION PROTOCOL

(Non-U.S. depositors: Please read shipping instructions on next page)

- 1. Voucher sample should be sent by commercial carrier (i.e., FEDEX, UPS, DHL, etc.) and be sent overnight. Contact NLGRP-PVP-Coordinator@usda.gov if other delivery options are needed (i.e., local drop off)
- 2. Depositor must notify NLGRP prior to shipment and include tracking information. Send notification to: <a href="https://www.nlc.number.nc.number
- 3. Complete and attach **PVP POTATO TISSUE CULTURE VOUCHER DEPOSIT FORM** to shipment notification email AND enclose a copy of printed form with material.
- 4. If Depositor is generating tissue culture samples themselves, they must follow this protocol. If using contracting laboratories to produce plantlets for submission to NLGRP, the depositor is responsible for ensuring laboratories follow the voucher submission protocol. This ensures the safe delivery and deposit of the samples to NLGRP and reduces the risk of having to resubmit the plantlets due to poor shipping and handling.
- 5. Ten (10) separate in vitro plants (one plant per tube) firmly rooted in 1 % agar and tubes shipped upright in package should be deposited. Plantlets should not be older than two weeks; note date of culture on each tube.
- 6. NLGRP requests that the depositor provides instructions for maintenance of materials. Strict confidentiality will be maintained by the PVPO and NLGRP as to the specifics of instructions, in accordance with law and equity.
- 7. Labels required on outside of package:

"Live Plants"; "Open Package Immediately"; "Do Not Place in Cold Storage"; multiple "Arrows" indicating right side up.
