

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR SETS SOFTWARE ON DISK 1 OF THE 1994-96 CD-ROM

SETS access software is contained on Disk 1; 1.5 megabytes of free space are required on the hard drive. The README.TXT file on Disk 1 contains information on problems with installation and hardware requirements for the software. The installation routine copies a few program files to the hard disk; when starting SETS, Disk 1 has to be in the CD-ROM drive. Please disable any virus scanners before installation.

DOS Users

1. Place Disk 1 in the CD-ROM drive.
2. At the C:\> prompt, access the CD-ROM drive by typing the letter of the drive and a colon. Press **ENTER**.
3. At the CD-ROM drive prompt, type **INSTALL** and press **ENTER**.
4. At the message “**Enter destination drive**”, type the letter of the hard drive where you want to copy the SETS program files to—usually C. A directory will be created called **C:\CSFI9496**.
5. When installation is complete the DOS prompt should read **C:\CSFI9496>**. Type **SETS** and press **ENTER**.

Windows 95/98/NT Users

1. Place Disk 1 in the CD-ROM drive and start Windows Explorer.
2. Find the **My Computer** folder and click on it once. On the right side of the screen look for an entry called **Csfi9496_1**. Alternately, or if you know the drive letter of your CD-ROM, double click on the icon next to it.
3. Double click on the icon that looks like this  and has the filename **INSTALL** next to it. A DOS window will appear. At the message “**Enter destination drive**”, type the letter of the hard drive where you want to copy the SETS program files to—usually C. A directory will be created called **C:\CSFI9496**.
4. When installation is complete close the DOS window by clicking on the x in the upper right hand corner of the DOS box. Ignore the message “To begin, type SETS while in this directory.”
5. In Windows Explorer look for a subdirectory labeled **CSFI9496** in the C drive (or whatever drive letter you used in step 3 above) and click on it.
6. Double click on the icon that looks like this  and has the filename **SETS** next to it. This will start the SETS program. When you exit the program you will have to close the DOS window. (Check with your computer support personnel to customize the shortcut that gets created the first time you start the program.)

Alternatively, you can open a DOS window and follow the instructions for DOS users.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR RUNNING THE CODEBOOK SEARCH PROGRAM ON DISK 1 OF THE 1994-96 CD-ROM

The Codebook Search Program is contained on Disk 1. These instructions are for executing the program from the disk only; no files are copied to your hard drive. (Copying the files to your hard drive requires about 42 megabytes of free space; please see your computer support personnel if you are not sure how to copy the files.)

DOS Users

1. Place Disk 1 in the CD-ROM drive.
2. At the C:\> prompt, access the CD-ROM drive by typing the letter of the drive and a colon. Press **ENTER**.
3. At the first CD-ROM drive prompt, type **cd cbsrch** and press **ENTER**. This will put you in the directory where the program is located.
4. At the second CD-ROM drive prompt, type **cbsrch** and press **ENTER**. This will start the program.

Windows 95/98/NT Users*

1. Place Disk 1 in the CD-ROM drive and start Windows Explorer.
2. Find the **My Computer** folder and click on it once. On the right side of the screen look for an entry called **Csf9496_1**. Alternately, if you know the drive letter of your CD-ROM, double click on the icon next to it.
3. Look for a subdirectory labeled **cbsrch** in the CD-ROM drive and double click on it.
4. Double click on the icon that looks like this  and has the filename **Cbsrch** next to it. This will start the Codebook Search program. A DOS window will appear and then the program will appear inside the DOS window. Use the ESCAPE key (ESC) to exit the program, which in turn will close the DOS window.

***Please note that virus scanners may interfere with the use of this application.**
